Promos catch on

THE Bribie RSL Club's popular host Carmel has introduced exciting changes to the regular gaming room promotions.

Operations manager John Brittain said two new promotional game shows that started on April 1 had been well received.

"These two new shows were introduced along with changes to a couple of others," Mr Brittain said.

Toad tadpoles caught

BRIBIE Island Environmental Protection Association volunteers have been participating in the ground-breaking Cane Toad Challenge.

The volunteers have collected hundreds of cane toads from the Vietnam Veterans Park across the road from the RSL Club.

The citizen science challenge is held under the auspices of the University of Queensland BioScience Department's Professor Rob Capon.

Aimed at fast-tracking the rollout of cane

toad tadpole trapping, the scientists discovered that cane toad tadpoles are drawn to a chemical attractant released by toad eggs.

They isolated and identified this chemical and developed tadpole attractant baits called BufoTabs.

When placed in the shallows where cane toad tadpoles congregate, a single BufoTab in a funnel trap attracts and traps several thousand tadpoles in a few hours.

Warrigals running into strong form

THE Bribie Island Warrigals are in the hunt for a semi-final spot in their Sunshine Coast rugby league competition.

At the completion of the fifth round of the Vantage Homes Division 2 Pool A format, the Warrigals are sitting eighth in the 11-team set-up on 14 points.

However the Warrigals, who once again this season are sponsored by the Bribie RSL Club, are only six points behind leaders Cooloom on 20 points.

Head coach David Lightfoot said he was satisfied with his side's progress, although injuries were biting into his fairly small squad.

"The boys are training well and have won two matches and lost two as well as picking up a bye," he said.

"There is still room for improvement and we have three under 18s playing in our squad as unfortunately we could not field an under 18s this season. Hopefully they will be back for next season."

Lightfoot said one bonus had been the return

to playing of former junior Michael Austin, who was in fine form until he damaged his knee ligaments.

"Also we lost Trae Beckett in a friendly match to a broken thumb but he should be back soon. Trae is probably our most influential payer who is very versatile as he can play as an edge forward or in the centres as he has a good step."

Lightfoot has moved up from the coaching co-ordinator role last season to take on the head coach job. He is drawing on years of experience in the United Kingdom to inspire his young charges.

Upcoming home fixtures are on May 11 v Maroochydore, June 15 v Stanley River and June 23 v Gympie.

Training is held on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6.30 to 8pm at the club's home ground.

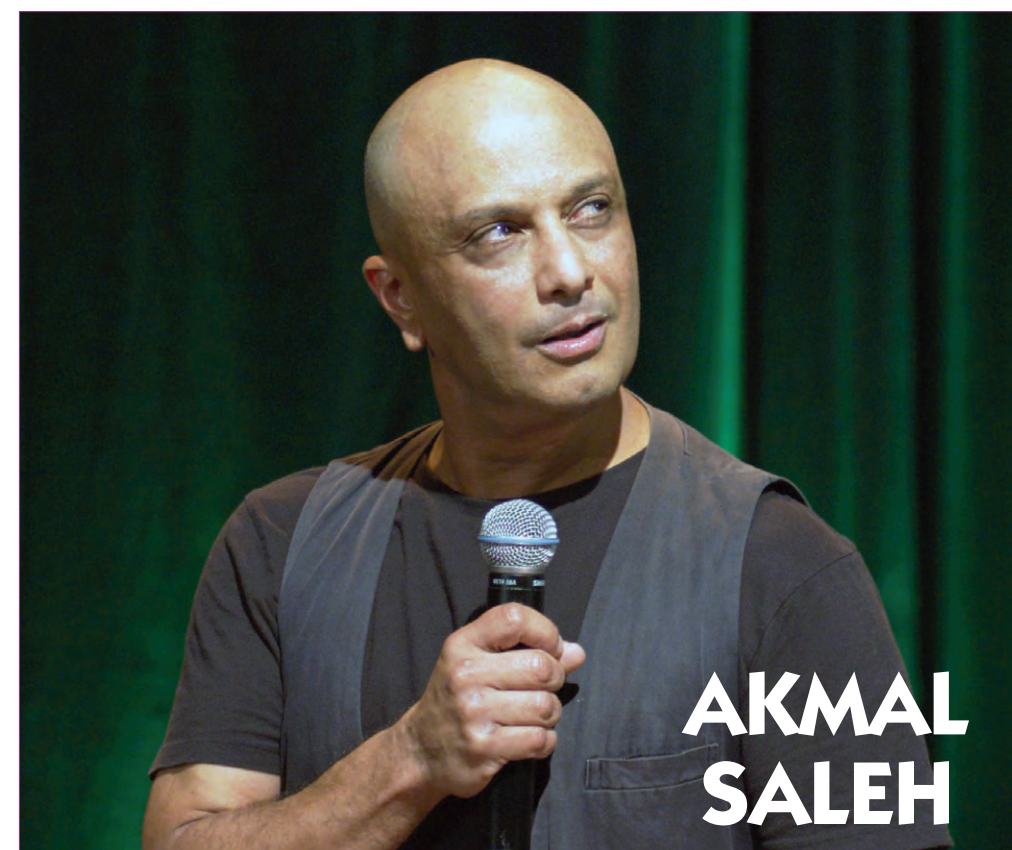
The two-hour live show consists of all Queen's greatest hits including

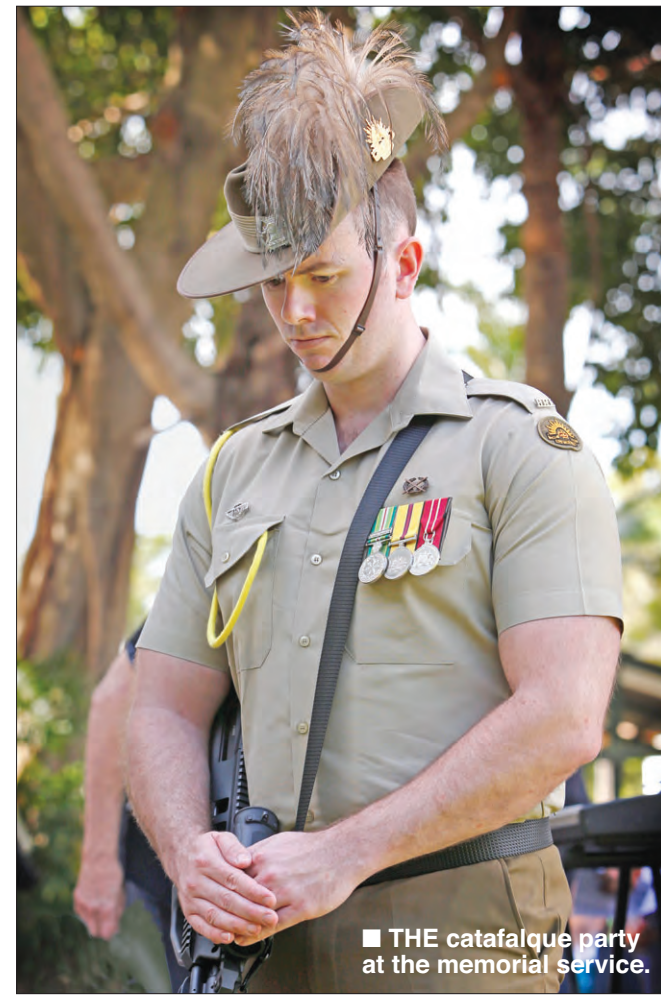

The raffle was drawn on April 12.



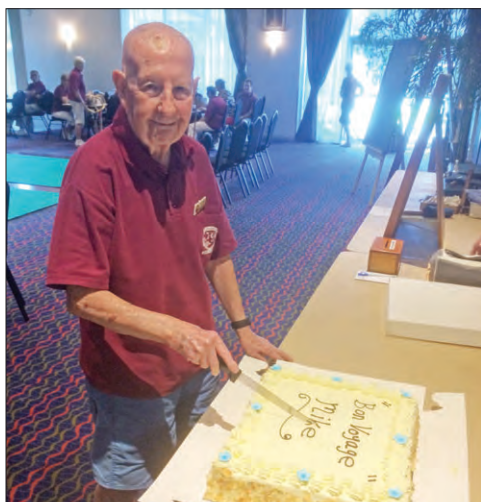
